







Griffon Vulture reintroduction in Bulgaria



**Imported 264 Griffon vultures
- 210 released**

**44 death cases, 50%
electrocution**

12-15 breeding pairs

1st chick in 2015





Griffon Vulture Transports

- Total of 264 vultures (2009-2014)

- Spain (Extremadura, Andalucía, Castilla y León, Castilla La-Mancha y País Vasco) 80%
- France 10%
- EEP, Zoos 10%











Black Vulture - population trend



Captive breeding network (EEP) since 1986



- 50 zoos
- 86 breeding pairs
- total of 321 individuals
- Low breeding success (21,7%)

Origin of the reintroduced birds: wild individuals collected in wildlife rehabilitation centres...(griffon & black vultures)



Bearded Vulture - distribution map




Bearded vulture captive breeding EEP

5 specialised centres:

- Three big (15-20 BV)
- Richard Faust Bartgeier Zuchtzentrum, Austria
- Centro cria de Guadalestín, Andalucía
- Valcallent, Catalunya
- Two small, (5-10 BV)
 - Haute Savoie, Francia
 - Goldau, Suiza
- 38 zoos, most of them in Europe
- Private collections

Breeding stock 2014:
153 individuals / 37 pairs










Distribution of Bearded Vulture Breeding Units 2014 with Release Sites used 2014

- Pyrenees




Figure 1. Distribution of mean-day locations of individual satellite-tracked pre-adult bearded vultures of the wild Pyrenean population ($n=9$), and the reintroduced populations of Andalusia ($n=13$) and the Alps ($n=24$). Stars show release points.




Bearded Vulture - population trend



Conclusions

- ✓ The reintroduction of vultures works – good method for the species recovery
- ✓ “know-how”
- ✓ Viability studies
- ✓ IUCN guidelines for reintroductions
- ✓ Black and Griffon vultures are available from the Spanish recovery centers
- ✓ Bearded vulture EEP is the only source for birds
- ✓ New projects for Black vultures are starting (Bulgaria y Burgos)
- ✓ Bearded vulture priority – Corridor and Andalusia
- ✓ Egyptian vulture – invest in captive breeding and establish methodology for releasing
